#### PRESIDENT'S LETTER

In reviewing our most recent Trust & Investments department newsletter I was particularly interested in the article from the last page entitled "Quick Facts: Retirement". As I approach my mid-50's it is amazing to me how real the scenarios described in that article, and others I've read, have become for me. Most of my prior

experience in this area has always been that of advisor or dealing with a friend or customer of the bank as they toil with the very important life event of retirement. I would certainly advise you, whether you are 25 or 65 to consider some of the following as it applies to you.

Let me provide a quick synopsis of some points from the article I referenced above:

- 1. According to Aon Hewitts "The Real Deal" 2012 study, an average full-career contributing employee needs 11x pay at the age of 65 (after Social Security) to expect to have sufficient assets to last through retirement. For example, if your salary is \$80,000, you will need to have accumulated \$880,000 by the time you're 65 and ready to retire.
- 2. In reality, the same employee is expected to have only 8.8x pay in resources at retirement, which translates into a 2.2x pay shortfall. To reuse the example from above, this means you would be \$176,000 short.
- 3. Only 18% of workers are very confident they will have enough money to live comfortably in retirement (according to the EBRI 2014 Retirement Confidence Survey).

The above, coupled with some of the following statistics about Social Security, certainly highlights the need to take action when it comes to retirement planning. Certainly not with an intent to frighten anyone, but in an effort to make sure we are taking a realistic outlook for Social Security, there are some numbers that we must review. According to the Social Security's website, as of April of 2014:

- By 2033, the number of older Americans will increase from 46.6 million today to over 77 million.
- There are currently 2.8 workers for each Social Security beneficiary. By 2033, there will be 2.1 workers for each beneficiary.

- In 1940, the life expectancy of a 65-yearold was almost 14 years; today it is nearly 20 years
- An estimated 165 million workers are covered under Social Security.
  - ➤ 51% of the workforce has no private pension coverage.
  - ➤ 34% of the workforce has no savings set aside specifically for retirement.

Our staff and I feel a great deal of responsibility as community bankers to inform our customers about retirement. I want to be sure that you are thinking about it and planning for it early enough to make a difference. As you know, we also have a Trust & Investments department here at the bank. I urge you to speak with one of our financial planning professionals. Whether you are just getting started on a retirement plan, or would like them to look your current plan and make sure that you are on the right path, please give them a call.

## PRODUCT FOCUS: OVERDRAFT PRIVILEGE

At times, unanticipated expenses or unforeseen problems can leave you with too little cash in your checking account. Having a check returned due to insufficient funds can be a costly, inconvenient and potentially embarrassing experience.

At City State Bank, we do not encourage overdrafts. As always, we encourage you to manage your finances responsibly. However, we want to save you from the additional merchant fees and possible damage to your credit history that might result if a check is returned. That is why we provide 'Overdraft Privilege,' a special service for City State Bank's checking customers.

Overdraft Privilege is a discretionary service that is provided to eligible accounts. Your account will have a limit that you are allowed to overdraw, provided your account is in 'good standing'. (For example, we typically do not pay overdrafts if your account has not been positive within the last 30 days, you are not making regular deposits, or you have a past due loan, garnishment, or levy). Transactions will be approved, up to this limit, even if you do not have sufficient funds in your account. Please be aware that this is intended for inadvertent or occasional use, such as a balance miscalculation or unexpected expense. You are encouraged to setup an automatic transfer from a savings account as a first line of defense against overdrafts.

Overdraft Privilege is automatically provided to eligible accounts and there is no charge unless you use the service. If you do not overdraw your account, you will never be charged an Overdraft or Return Item fee. If you prefer not to have Overdraft Privilege on your account please call 515–981-4234 and we will remove it.

If you want to have Overdraft Privilege cover ATM and everyday debit card transactions in addition to checks and ACH items, YOU MUST OPT IN.

How do you Opt In? Just call or stop in to your local branch and let us know. Have peace of mind knowing ODP is there if you need it!

Subject to bank discretion. Overdraft charge of \$25 per item imposed for overdrafts created by checks, in person withdrawals, ACH, Point-of-Sale, ATM withdrawals or by other electronic means. Payment of your overdraft is discretionary and we reserve the right not to pay. For example, we typically do not pay if your account is not in good standing, you are not making regular deposits, or you have too many overdrafts.
